
TREAT FUND

The main focus of planned learning and teaching will cover the following areas of the curriculum: • Health and Wellbeing • Literacy and English

Numeracy and Maths

The learning and teaching experiences will be tailored to

meet children's interests, therefore ensuring that

planning is responsive.

Health and Wellbeing

We have been concentrating on routines, personal hygiene, promoting independence and responsibility. Over the next few weeks, the children will become familiar with our Values and help to identify key responsibilities with

the help of Fraser Bear. We will also be looking at feelings and have recently introduced the story of The Colour Monster to help children express how they are feeling.

Literacy and English

The Talk4Writing and Word Aware programmes will be introduced to the

children. These are both successful and well-established programmes which aim to establish strong foundations in storytelling and story writing.

Numeracy and Maths

The focus over the next few weeks is to build on the children's existing knowledge of numbers and counting.

We will be practicing counting forwards and backwards.

in/out.


New library bags will be given out soon to our new children.
