Dear Parents,



I hope this newsletter finds you well as we move into the winter months.

Our School Improvement Plan for this session sets out our change to literacy pedagogy, with this term a focus on reading strategies and skills. All teachers attend training and are supported in planning by Mrs Longstaff, our Literacy Champion. On our in-service day, we received training in reading pedagogical approaches from the West Partnership who are our Regional Improvement Collaborative. All teaching staff have visited other schools to gather good practice examples and shared these at staff meetings. We have created new planning documents and agreed a whole school approach to teaching reading to increase pupil attainment. We will continue to build on this great start to improve literacy further at Twechar PS.

During November the management team will engage in further quality assurance. We will do this through classroom visits to observe learning and teaching, taking part in learning walks to discuss learning with pupils, and capture their evaluations of this new way of learning through teaching and mentoring meetings to discuss each child's progress. We look forward to showcasing our great work with you next term.

This year we are delighted to have all our usual Christmas celebrations underway. Primary 1-3 children will prepare and present a nativity called 'Busy, Busy, Bethlehem'. P5-P7 children will perform our Christmas show 'The Wizard of Oz'. We look forward to welcoming you to our school events.

Our excellent, hardworking Parent Council must be congratulated for their fantastic Hallowe'en Discos – what great fun! The Parent Council will man a stall at Parents' Evening to ask families what improvements they would like to see in our school playground and ask for ideas for events you would like to see in school for our children and families.

All events require helpers beyond the Parent Council in order to run safely. Without helpers we will be unable to run large events outwith school time, so please let them know if you can volunteer to help at school events and support them to bring fun, memorable activities for our children.

FAMILY LEARNING UPDATE



Family Learning encourages family members to learn together as and within a family, with a focus on Intergenerational learning. Family learning activities can also be specifically designed to enable parents to learn how to support their children's learning. 'Family learning is a powerful method of engagement and learning which can foster positive attitudes towards lifelong learning, promote socio-economic resilience and challenge educational disadvantage'.

Who leads Family Learning and who is it for? My name is Denise McMunn and I am the Family Learning Assistant for Twechar Primary School. Family Learning is open to all families. I would encourage families to become involved because of the positive impact it can have on all children. Family Learning enhances learning for your child and improves outcomes. It's that simple! A joined up approach is important. We can help!

Our Primary 3 children were given the opportunity to participate in weekly gardening sessions where they planted and tended to fruit and vegetables at the garden area within the grounds of the Twechar HLEC next to the school. The vegetables that were grown and harvested were subsequently on display at the HLEC annual Harvest Fayre in September and were available at the event for members of the community to take home.

As we teach our children about the importance of sustainable living, we have a supply of good quality items of preloved school uniform available. With the temperature dropping daily, Twechar Primary School also has a small number of good quality, pre-loved winter coats and jackets on offer to those who may need them. Please ask!

We understand that the current economic climate has had an impact on many families' income due to reduced hours, job loss or other circumstances. Please, if you are struggling to get by don't feel stuck — we are here to help. We now have a confidential electronic referral system to the foodbank. There will be a letter sent out to all families with further information.

LITERACY

PI/2 have been very busy learning new sounds. They are super at remembering the action and song to go with each sound. PI have been looking for things around the class and outside that begin with their sound of the week. P2 have been looking for their phonemes in their reding books. PI/2 have produced some fabulous writing this term and know that a sentence should have a capital letter and full stop. They have been listening to stories about Percy the Park Keeper and have written lots about him!

MATHS

PI/2 have been trying hard with their numeracy. Pl know numbers before and after, up to 10. They use their rhymes to help form these numbers. P2 have been working on numbers to 100 and are making great progress. PI/2 love to play number games as part of their 'Target Tasks' during play, which helps to consolidate what they have learned.

OTHER AREAS

PI/2 enjoyed learning about Under the Sea creatures through literacy. We read stories such as 'The Rainbow Fish', 'The Snail and The Whale' and 'Sharing a Shell'. We learned lots about sharing and being kind. We made a display about how we would like our class to be. Primary I/2 have taken an interest in Castles and have decided they'd like to find our lots more about them this term.

LITERACY

Writing – this term we have been focusing on suspense stories, through the model text Funny Bones. We are working towards writing suspense stories of our own. Reading – We have been learning about summarising, using the 5 finger approach to pull out key information. We have used this across a range of media including story books, films such as Shrek, and poems.

Grammar – we are focusing on all different types of punctuation including full stops, capital letters, question marks and speech marks. We are understanding what each of these are and when these are used. We are starting to incorporate these into our own writing.

OTHER AREAS

P2/3 have been looking at the Rainforest this term. We have located rainforests on a map and how their location impacts the climate to create the hot and wet weather. We have designed posters on the different layers of the rainforest and have created our own rainforest on the wall in our classroom. We will be focusing on different animals of the rainforest and how they have adapted to survive there and will go on to understand the dangers the rainforests are facing currently.

MATHS

Number Processes – we are looking at numbers to 100 and 3 digit numbers to 100. We have been developing an understanding of this using place value strategies, filling in missing numbers and sequencing these.

Time – we have discussed the importance of learning to tell the time and all the things this helps us to do – including catching a bus, and going to see a movie in the cinema. We will look at o'clock, half past and quarter to and past times. We will be able to read and write these times on both digital and analogue clocks.

LITERACY

Spelling - this term has focused a lot on Active Literacy partner work strategies. This involved the children breaking words down into the different sound combinations and studying how sounds can look different across a variety of words. For example, the ee sound in sleep and she. Reading - we focused on using our reading tools to read aloud with fluency and expression. The children are becoming more and more skilled at skimming and scanning texts, sharing what they imagine stories to look like (visualisation) and summarising key events.

Writing - we have focused on writing suspense stories, full of spooky settings and interesting characters.

MATHS

This term has focused on mental maths strategies children can use to solve addition and subtraction problems. P3/4 have enjoyed game based approaches to complete their learning, using cards, dice and online games. They are consolidating this learning in real life scenarios, through money lessons with Mrs Laidlaw once a week too.

LITERACY

In literacy we are using different spelling strategies, such as diacritical marking to help us understand the different sounds that make up a word. We are focusing on nouns and adjectives, adding depth to our understanding when we read. We've been focusing on visualisation and prediction techniques to do this. We are looking at the features of a suspense story and will be writing our own soon!

MATHS

We are focusing on multiplication and division in numeracy, and how we can use different strategies to multiply numbers within 100. We are also focusing on time, continuing to use both analogue and digital clocks when completing time calculations.
