CONTACT DETAILS

Please let us know if you have changed your phone number or home address recently. It is very important we have working contact details in case your child becomes unwell or we need to contact you urgently.

CLOTHING

We kindly ask that belongings are clearly labelled to ensure items can be found with ease. To ensure your child is comfortable, soft shoes should be worn indoors. We ask that these shoes are not slippers as they can become loose easily and/or children can slide in them. We play outdoors in all weathers, so we recommend clothing for all seasons. We often explore the local area, and wellies and a jacket are essential throughout the year.

FAMILY LEARNING

We are looking to start a family learning programme and would like to gather some ideas/suggestions from parents on topics. For example, a 4-week block of baking/gardening/craft sessions with your child. Please share your ideas by emailing us or add to our suggestion box in the foyer.

FAMILIES CONNECT PROGRAM

Families Connect is a programme that builds on parent's existing skills and knowledge, providing confidence to support your child's learning. Families Connect also builds relationships between parents and the nursery and provides opportunities for parents to share ideas and experiences with each other. SAFETY FIRST

If someone else is collecting your child, please let us know and we can add them to the list of authorised people to do so. 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LITERACY FOCUS

Last term our Talk4Writing story was Goldilocks and the 3 Bears. This proved a very popular choice and the children were very engaged in this story, taking part in a variety of learning experiences across the Curriculum. The children became authors & illustrators as they created their own story maps using Goldilocks as the structure for their stories.

This term our new Talk4Writing story is The Gingerbread Man, as the children were showing an interest in this story before Christmas. We have already read the book and started to learn actions to the story using the Model Text. Our

Word Aware words will be selected from the story.





NUMERACY FOCUS

This term we are continuing to work on counting forwards and backwards plus recognising numbers. We will be focusing on 1 to 1 correspondence and subitising. 1 to 1 correspondence is learning how to count a group of objects by assigning one number to each object and only counting each object once. Subitising is learning to look at a group of objects and realise how many there are without counting. This helps with the development of early number sense.

Please take time to look at our "We are Learning....." board in the cloakroom. This will be updated regularly with information about the main focus for learning in Literacy & Numeracy.
