Please let us know if you have changed your phone number or home address recently. It is very important we have working contact details in case your child becomes unwell or we need to contact you urgently.


**SAFETY FIRST**

Please be aware of your child's session times as this can have an impact on the running of the Nursery day.


#### BIRTHDAY CAKES


You may hand a shop bought cake in for your child's birthday, if you wish. This must not contain nuts *(traces are OK).*





### LITERACY AND NUMERACY FOCUS

#### Literacy

The children are continuing to develop their drawing and pre writing skills through our writing programme called "Foundations of Writing". The children have been concentrating on drawing detailed pictures of themselves, with a focus on faces, hair and hats. The themes for drawing were linked to our Story of the Week such as Clive Penguin who wore a woolly tea cosy as a hat. The children were encouraged to try on different hats, look in mirrors and then draw what they saw.







The children have been continuing to take part in weekly reading sessions where they listen to a story, known as a shared text. There has been a focus on asking "comprehension" questions which encourages children to use clues from the story to answer questions e.g.in the story of Hurry Santa how do you think Santa felt when he realised he'd slept in? The children are becoming familiar with our Word Aware programme, which is a structured approach to teaching vocabulary. Concept Cat has been teaching the children about different words selected from our Story of the Week e.g. over, search, sparkly. The children get a sticker with the word so please ask your child what the word on their sticker means.

#### Numeracy & Maths



The children have been developing their Early Number Sense by working on their subitizing skills. Subitizing is the ability to identify the number of items in a group without counting. This is an important skill because it lays the foundation for more advanced mathematical understanding. By being able to recognize small groups of objects without counting, children can develop a strong sense of numbers and their relationships. As children progress, their ability to subitize can significantly enhance their understanding and application of addition, subtraction, multiplication and addition. In particular the children have been using finger patterns, dice dot patterns, 5 and 10 frames to develop their subitizing skills.

We have been also learning about patterns, and finding different patterns within our environment. The children have been copying, continuing and creating repeating patterns with 2 or 3 different objects.

# **Safe Sleep Policy**



All children at Twechar Early Years Centre have the right to be safe and rest/sleep when needed. This policy sets out clear principles and guidelines on supporting resting/sleeping children. In the belief that proactive steps can be taken to lower the risk of SIDS in child

care settings and that parents and child care professionals can work

together to keep children safer while they sleep. Twechar EYC will practice the following sleep policy.

This policy is supported by Safe Sleep Scotland.

At Twechar EYC we value, celebrate and fully embrace to the principles of equality, diversity and inclusion. This requires us all to recognise and respect each other's differences. Creating an inclusive work environment where we all feel a sense of belonging helps us to do our best work, which results in the best possible outcomes for children in our care.

Twechar EYC will ensure that:

- All Key workers will familiarise themselves with safe sleep best practice.
- Parents/Carers will be asked at the time of settling period if said child will require a sleep when at nursery.
- An area of the room will be a designated sleep area and all resources will be moved out of reach of children.
- All children must sleep on a rest mat (children may be put to sleep in a buggy when specified by parent or carer, however the child must then be transferred onto a rest mat to continue their sleep)
- Each child will have their own individual bedding and blanket. This will be stored in a canvas bag with a picture of the child.
- This will be washed in a 60 degrees wash weekly.
- Children will be placed on their backs to sleep. They can be allowed to adopt whatever position they preference when the child turns onto his/her side or stomach.
- Children can have a dummy/comfort teddy if provided by the parent/carer
- Visual supervision is required at all times. At least every 15 minutes the key person will visually check on the child; looking for the rise and fall of the chest and record this on a sleep chart.
- Room temperature should be preferably kept between 16 and 20 degrees
- Shoes and any jackets or outer layers should always be removed when going to sleep
- No smoking is permitted on the premises and key persons who smoke will ensure that their clothes and breath do not smell of smoke when caring for children within the nursery.
